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Summary	<p><i>I would like to establish a relationship with three associations in and around Zagreb, with whom we would work at least once a month. The students (Grades 1-12) will volunteer at different times for the following associations:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <i>1. Elderly home Lavoslava Schwarza</i> <i>2. S.O.S Dječje selo Hrvatska (Children's Home)</i> <i>3. PUŽ (Put u Život) – parent association for children with special needs</i>
Vision	<p><i>Every student at AISZ should have an opportunity for Service learning. Service learning does not only positively impact academic learning and critical thinking but also personal development, cultural awareness, and civic participation. Students develop skills such as collaboration, leadership, and problem solving. After leaving AISZ they will be more proactive, prepared and compassionate citizens.</i></p>
Success	<p><i>Success would be if this becomes sustainable, ongoing, expected and a valued part of our school culture.</i></p>
How	<p><u>Step 1</u> <i>In early September, I will look for 3-5 volunteers from grades 11 and 12, because I want to include the students as much as possible into the planning, implementation and action.</i></p> <p><u>Step 2</u> <i>Students will call the three associations to arrange meetings in order to discuss what they need and how we can help.</i></p> <p><u>Step 3</u> <i>In early October, representatives from the three associations will talk to our students in an assembly about their work and why they chose to work for that particular association.</i></p> <p><u>Step 4</u> <i>With their findings in mind, the students will develop a detailed timetable and action plan for each grade level by the end of October. Each grade level will have a different goal and way of helping those ones in need.</i></p> <p><u>Step 5</u> <i>With the timetable in mind, each grade level starts preparing for their visits. We will start with the visits in early November and will continue on a monthly basis until May 2019.</i></p> <p><i>The ultimate goal is to establish a strong relationship with the three association and to continue our work in the following years.</i></p>

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Challenges	<p><i>A big challenge for the students might be good organization and time management. We can overcome this challenge by teaching our students organizational skills and by scheduling time for the students to meet and to work on the projects.</i></p> <p><i>Another challenge might be collaboration. By helping the students build trust amongst themselves and making sure that everyone’s voice is heard we can help them overcome this challenge.</i></p> <p><i>Coordination might be another challenge. Good communication skills might help overcome this challenge as well.</i></p>
